The Morris County School of Technology continues to offer courses under the aegis of NJIT so that students may earn college credit. The following courses will be offered for 2014-2015 school year:

English Composition: Writing, Speaking, Thinking (HUM 101 – 3 credits, 1<sup>st</sup> semester) English Composition: Writing, Speaking, Thinking (HUM 102 – 3 credits, 2<sup>nd</sup> semester) Economics (ECON 265 – 3 credits, 1<sup>st</sup> semester) Economics (ECON 266 – 3 credits, 2<sup>nd</sup> semester)

Although these courses are full year at MCST, credit at NJIT is awarded on semester basis. Students may elect to pay for and attempt to earn 6 college credits for each course or 3 credits for the first semester only (HUM 101 or Econ 265). If students elect the first semester only, they still must complete the full year of the course in order to receive a final grade and credit on their MCST transcript.

Please be advised that if students choose to take advantage of this opportunity to receive college credit in addition to their high school credits awarded by the Morris County School of Technology, you will be required to make payment to MCST. Credits are assessed and will be payable at the rate of \$125.00 per credit hour. Registration and payment for both fall <u>and</u> spring courses are due by Friday, September 12, 2014. Attached are the registration form and directions for your convenience.
